With violent incidents on the rise and the intensity of these causing serious injury to our members it is more important than ever to ensure that proper reporting is happening and that risk assessments are being conducted to ensure adequate control measures are being implemented to protect our members.

It is with great pleasure that the Union can announce we have sixty-seven Joint Occupational Health and Safety CUPE Representative at various sites around our District. The Union's goal is to continue to provide educational resources and mentorship to those reps so that they can better support our members who are dealing with health and safety issues within their respective workplaces. We still have a handful of sites with only one rep and we hope to get those vacancies filled early in the New Year.

On November 9th CUPE 411 ratified the Memorandum of Agreement, and on November 26th the School District Trustees did the same. This officially concludes the 2019 Negotiations and as such the Bargaining team has been disbanded. We would like to take extend a "Thank you" to those members that were elected to represent their respective divisions at the bargaining table; Glenda Johnson, Assistants (et.al.) / Shana Kirkland, Clerical / Rod Isaac, Custodial / Josh Bouthot, Maintenance / Steven Clarke, Transportation. We would also like to say "Thank you" to the three Servicing Reps that acted as our Chief Spokesperson during various stages of the bargaining process; Bryan Bickley, Troy Clifford, and Jeanne Marr.
